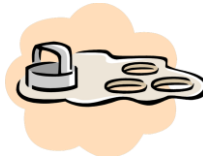


CARAMEL PUFF CORN



2 sticks butter – do not use margarine	½ t baking soda
2 C brown sugar	1 t vanilla
½ C white corn syrup	2 bags puffed corn (Chester’s)

Boil butter, brown sugar, and white corn syrup for 3 minutes then add baking soda and vanilla. Pour mixture over puffed corn and bake for 1 hour at 250° - stir every 15 minutes. A deep roasting pan works best for this.



SWEET POTATO BISCUITS

1 C mashed sweet potatoes	2 T sugar
3 ½ t baking powder	4 T melted margarine
2/3 C milk	½ t salt
1 ¼ C flour	

Sift dry ingredients. Mix mashed sweet potatoes, milk and melted margarine. Add remaining ingredients to make a soft dough. Turn out dough onto a floured board and toss lightly until outside looks smooth. Roll out ½-inch thick; cut out with biscuit cutter. Place on greased pan. Bake in hot oven (450°) for about 15 minutes.



CORN PUDDING

2 14oz cans creamed corn	¼ C margarine or butter, melted
1 11oz can whole kernel corn, drained	3T cornstarch
4 large eggs	¼ C finely chopped onion
1/3 C sugar	1 ½ t seasoned salt
½ C milk	½ t ground mustard

Combine cream-style corn, whole kernel corn, onion and eggs in a large bowl. Add mixture of sugar, cornstarch, seasoned salt and ground mustard. Stir in milk and melted butter. Pour mixture into greased 3-quart casserole dish. Bake one hour at 350°, stirring once after 30 minutes. Makes 12 servings.
