All degree seeking students must have official post-graduation transcripts (high school, home school, or proof of GED) from each institution attended sent by the granting institution directly to Barton. Home school credit evaluations may be submitted in lieu of a transcript or diploma from the school administrator. **NOTE:** Student will be admitted as a "Special Student" until all transcripts from previously attended institutions are received and evaluated.
4. If you are applying to the following majors you must complete a special application from the respective department.
 - Medical Laboratory Technician
 - Medical Assistant
 - Nursing
 - Paramedic (MICT)
5. Students entering college for the first time, pursuing a certificate or degree, or enrolling in a class requiring test scores must have ACT, SAT, Accuplacer or ASSET scores on file with Barton. Students without test scores must take the Accuplacer or ASSET test. (Fort Riley students may submit or take the Compass test). Barton's assessment is free of charge. Contact the Testing Center at (620) 792-9344 or 800-748-7594 for a testing schedule or further information. These scores are used for placement in English, Reading, and Math courses.
6. To be considered for scholarships, complete the Barton Academic Scholarship Award Application section inside this form. The scholarship application deadline is March 15 for the following academic year.

KANSAS RESIDENCY STATEMENT AND REQUIREMENTS

- All applicants indicate your residency status on the application.
- For the purpose of being assessed college tuition, Kansas residents are persons, who, if adults, have resided, or if minors (under 18) whose parents have resided in Kansas for six months immediately preceding the first day of classes.
- In some cases, residency status is subject to interpretation by Barton. Such persons as financially independent students whose parents reside in another state, Non-residents who marry residents, military personnel and their dependents stationed in Kansas, and students acquiring an abode, whether by purchase, renting or otherwise and intending to live in it permanently or indefinitely, should consult Enrollment Services if in doubt about their residency status.
- It is the student's responsibility to enroll under the proper residency classification. If there is any question concerning residency status, it is the student's responsibility to raise the question in the Enrollment Services before paying fees.

Non U.S. Citizens

Certain undocumented immigrants and others may be eligible for resident tuition. This applies to any student who:

1. Has attended an accredited Kansas high school for three or more years and
2. either graduated from an accredited Kansas high school or has earned a GED issued in Kansas and
3. a. in the case of a person without lawful immigration status; has signed and filed an affidavit with the institution stating that the person or the person's parents have filed an application to legalize such person's immigration status, or will file such an application as soon as such person is eligible to do so or
- b. in the case of a person with a legal nonpermanent immigration status, has filed with the postsecondary education institution an affidavit stating that such person has filed an application to begin the process for U.S. citizenship or will file such application as soon as such person is eligible to do so.

Students who meet eligibility requirements should request an affidavit from the Admissions Office or the Office of Enrollment Services.

TAX SUMMARY INFORMATION

- The Taxpayer Relief Act of 1997 (TRA 97) provides many new tax benefits for persons who are paying higher education costs for themselves and members of their families.
- These benefits include the Hope Scholarship Credit and the Lifetime Learning Credit.
- You or the person(s) that claim you on their taxes could potentially be eligible for one of these credits.
- Based on current reporting requirements, Barton will be required to submit a Tuition Payments Statement (Form 1098-T) to the IRS and to the claimed student.
- This information will indicate whether the student was enrolled at least half-time during any one semester.
- All documents provide information necessary to determine eligibility for the tax credit.
