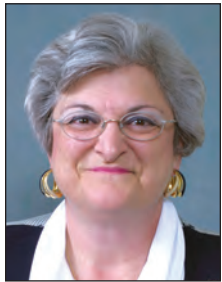

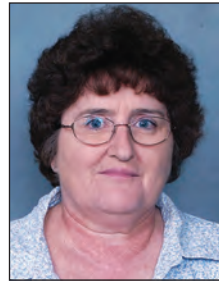

Rick Bealer

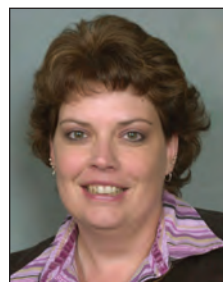

Angie Maddy

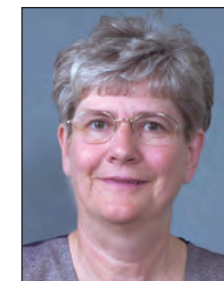
